As detailed in the last newsletter a considerable amount of work has occurred in the Wilson Street Studio to date. The Council will also be undertaking further works, to uplift our space. As it turns out the lift now requires a full replacement. The new lift is scheduled to be installed in September 2025. This is a great outcome for our members who have endured a number of issues with this piece of infrastructure in the past.

We will again delay our return to Wilson street, and we will remain at 2A Francis Street, Brighton East.

The Committee are seeking your cooperation to return all BAS equipment to the studio. We have purchased a number of boards that have been depleting over the first half of the year. BAS equipment is for use within the studio only and is not available for loan. If you are finding your work requires a board to take home please remember to bring one along.

In addition to the above we ask that all equipment is cleaned and returned neatly after use this is inclusive of tables, chairs, easels, extension cords and lights. In addition we would appreciate that tape placed on the dais, floor and furniture is removed when no longer required. In any given week there can be upwards of 200 people sharing the studio, if we all take an extra 2 minutes to carefully pack up that would be greatly appreciated.

Malcolm Beattie – Watercolour class 7erm 1, 2025

When running a class teaching art technique, I need to be mindful of the level of expertise of all class participants. I try to strike a balance somewhere between the less proficient and the more advanced students so that everybody will gain something from the class - and demonstrate something that is achievable during a single session. I endeavour to show the class the art of breaking even the most complex of scenes into its component parts, therefore allowing us to build a painting up bit by bit using basic watercolour techniques.

So, this is how I approached my first term of running a watercolour class for the Brighton Art Society. The aim was to finish one painting during each class, where I chose the subject and led the class through it step-by-step to completion, providing ongoing feedback and assistance where required.

Each class or exercise covered the stretching and preparation of the watercolour paper, colour mixing, the use of the brush, applying washes and glazes and an appreciation of the importance of tonal values in a painting. We undertook a variety of subject matter, ranging from landscapes to wildlife, seascapes and skyscapes. We also spent a lesson on pen and wash techniques, so handy for sketching out of doors and when time is limited.

The attached images are my demonstration paintings done step-by-step during the term.

This was a short, introductory term, and term 3, 2025 will be a full term of 9 classes commencing Starts

Demonstration Portraiture in Oil with Gwen Krumins

On Sunday 15 June, I had the pleasure of attending the Portrait in Oil demonstration, featuring the talented Gwen Krumins.

Gwen talked through her palette, materials and her approach to portraits openly, answering all questions while painting Ava our model during the 2 hour session.

I was really interested in Gwen's explanation of composition. She explained that what is left out, is as important as what is painted, to tell your story. "The less you say the more interesting the painting. It gives the viewer an opportunity to contemplate and interpret the painting." Gwen further stressed "Don't tell everything, be a secret keeper!"

Gwen starts her portraits by working out her proportions and thinly applying darks and mid tones to the canvas.



Once the first layer is down, Gwen progressively works at defining the shapes and tones she sees.

Gwen recommends when mixing new tones to always keep part of your original mix to see the progression in your new tone mix.

It was fascinating to see the model's image progressively appear on the canvas.

As the painting progressed the paint consistency became thicker and lighter tones where added towards the end of the demonstration.

A huge thank you to Gwen for sharing her approach and to Ava our model.

Digital Drawing and Painting with Richard Impey 4 Week Short Course

There is a growing interest in Digital Drawing and Painting. This course will focus on generating art works using Procreate and preparing them for professional printing and posting on Instagram. It will focus on individual projects generated by the student. General themes and alternate methods of artistic presentation will also be illustrated during the course.

In particular, this short course will provide an opportunity for artists to improve their skills in Digital Drawing and Painting by:

- · Investigate the use of brushes for line work, adding shading and working with textures. ·
- · Select colours, manipulating tints and shades and creating your own colour palettes for specific images.
- · Work with multiple layers, merge layers, change opacity levels, make selections, masks and applying special effects.
- · Import and work with your own watercolour backgrounds, pencil sketches and photographs.
- Setup specific canvas sizes, learn to use helpful naming conventions and use cloud storage.
- · Prepare your completed images for electronic publishing on Instagram and Facebook.
- · Prepare and export your images for professionally printing.

Note: If you are unsure about installing or upgrading Procreate on your IPad, you might like to go to an Apple store for help prior to the course. The Apple staff are fantastic. You will need to book.

Utilising Information Technology (IT) in an Artistic Practice with Richard Impey

Join us for an Sunday afternoon demonstration with Richard. Afternoon tea will be provided.

George Seurat, Paul Signac and Roy Lichtenstein utilised dots to form their art. Information Technology uses dots (Bytes) to further open up communication and art.

In this presentation Richard Impey will explore the application of Information Technology in the creation, development and presentation of art.

Digital technology lets you generate high-calibre artwork at a blistering pace using a robust layer's system, stunning filters, and thousands of importable brushes. A must have for serious artists and enthusiasts alike'. Digital software like Procreate, Adobe Fresco, Corel Painter, Kitra and Sketchbook can be used to sketch ideas, create designs and produce finished artwork. Richard frequently reinterprets his Procreate art using different media such as printing and oil painting. He finds Procreate to be an essential resource for his art and his art practice as it is so easy to use, flexible and transportable.

Information Technology also provides increased opportunity to present, duplicate, distribute and sell art to the wider community. Outlets like Instagram, Facebook, Pinterest and Twitter provide a link to other artist

work and an opportunity to distribute artists work to others. Richard will discuss how this assists him in his artistic activities.

In this presentation Richard will show how IT is integrated into his art practice.

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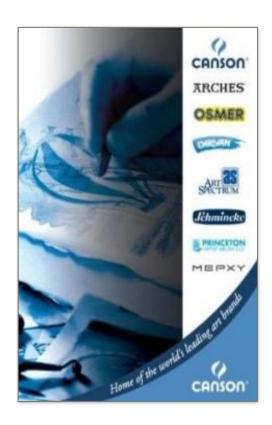
