JUDGES COMMENTS

Our judge for the prize categories at our exhibition this year was the esteemed member of the Twenty Melbourne Painters group: Fiona Bilbrough.

Fiona deliberated carefully in selecting the winners and made the following observations about her selections:

BEST IN SHOW - ESTA EDELSTEN - "A Day at the Beach"

Stunning abbreviation in quality mark making.

This is an example of less is more.

Lovely composition on a square format.





BEST WORK ON PAPER - MARK JACKSON - "Untitled"

A lovely expression of fluency in life drawing. Interesting compositional balance. A brave placement on the paper. A nice balance of thin and thick application of paint.



Very atmospheric. Lovely transition. Free brushwork.



BEST PORTRAIT - LYNTON DAEHLI - "Jackaroo Blue"

A lovely loose but fluent painting utilising a limited palette. The use of line is very considered and overall a great use of a square format. Hands nicely painted. A strong composition.





BEST NON-REALIST / ABSTRACT - ATHENIE LECKEY - BANKSIA MOB IV

A detailed analysis of an Australian scene in a broad stylised presentation. Colour combination well chosen.



BEST WATERCOLOUR - VINCENT DE FILIPPIS - "Bayside Brighton"

A stunning watercolour with limited palette. Calligraphic mark making, reminiscent of the great painter Ken Howard.



BEST ACRYLIC - ROSEMARY TAYLOR - "Skiing the Slopes Japan"

The abstract handling is very well considered and leaves plenty of room for the brain to fill in the gaps. Well executed.



BEST OIL - GEOFF GOWERS - "Adam"

A lovely fresh convincing portrait. Bold brushwork and clear tones.




